

"We're so proud to unveil our plastic-free Poppy," says Gordon Michie. "Completely recyclable, it will reduce our environmental impact and hopefully encourage more people than ever to take part in this year's Scottish Poppy Appeal."

Same iconic Poppy, only greener!

Made from bespoke red and green paper, the Poppy retains its iconic four petals with black centre embossed with 'Poppy Appeal'. It also looks wonderful pinned or worn in a buttonhole.

Yet with this evolution, Poppyscotland's guarantee remains the same. "The money raised will allow us to provide expert advice and guidance to support the Armed Forces community with mobility, homelessness and mental health issues," says Gordon. So get your Poppy soon!

Campaigning for equal access to welfare.

Thousands of disadvantaged veterans are missing out on vital welfare support, prompting Poppyscotland and the Royal British Legion to launch the Credit Their Service campaign.

At the moment, some military compensation is classed as income during the means-testing process of various benefit applications. However, this differs for civilian applications where awarded civic compensation is often not taken into account.

We believe that this is unjust and contradicts the commitment made by the UK Government. In 2011 the Armed Forces Covenant was signed and stated that individuals within the Armed Forces community should not face any disadvantages compared to civilians when accessing public and commercial services.

Our campaign is focused on challenging local and national governments to amend their welfare policies so that veterans can access the same welfare benefits as civilians.
